

# 2023 Labor Day Weekend Trip to Hampton

Once we pulled out of the slip I could tell that I had noticeably less propulsion and there was some vibration while motoring. Once we were out in the bay, we stopped motoring, furlled the sails and I dove in to take a look while we were drifting. Since I cleaned the boat in early July, the propeller had become entirely covered in barnacles. It was going to take a bit to scrape off the barnacles so I got out the Hookah system so I didn't have to come up for air. After that, the boat handled as expected.

The other adventure was docking. The docks at Hampton have very short finger piers and it is necessary to back in. There's also some current to contend with. On the second attempt, and a multi point turn (a lot of forward/backward maneuvering), I was able to get the boat backed in without any drama. Fortunately the crew and dockhand were patient. We walked around downtown Hampton and out to eat that evening. On Sunday morning we headed back home. We had enough wind to sail for a bit on Sunday morning before turning on the motor for the final stretch. We are looking forward to doing a trip together on the Potomac in the future!
